II. The Resurrection

- a. This is a physical resurrection but not a _____ resurrection of all dead. Dan 12:2-3 *And many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt.3 And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever. KJV*
- b. It is a _____ resurrection of Israelites, the primary subject of the passage is Daniel's historic people. Dan 12:1 *And at that time shall Michael stand up, the great prince which standeth for the children of thy people: KJV*
- c. Whether or not some _____ are also resurrected at this time may have been suggested by Isaiah. Isa 26:19 *Thy dead men shall live, together with my dead body shall they arise. Awake and sing, ye that dwell in dust: for thy dew is as the dew of herbs, and the earth shall cast out the dead. KJV*

III. The Repentance

- a. Of the many passages dealing with the turning of Israel to God in the last days, none is more vivid than that which is revealed by Zechariah. Here we can discover that the _____ is definitely stated. Zech 12:9-10 *And it shall come to pass in that day, that I will seek to destroy all the nations that come against Jerusalem. 10 And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of grace and of supplications: and they shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him, as one mourneth for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn. KJV*
- b. The cause of Israel's repentance is the work of God and is brought about by the tangible and _____ appearance of the King of Glory. Zech 12:10 *and they shall look upon me whom they have pierced*
- c. Israel's repentance will be _____, not superficial. It will be accompanied by deep and meaningful tears. Zech 12:11 *In that day shall there be a great mourning in Jerusalem, as the mourning of Hadadrimmon in the valley of Megiddon. KJV*
- d. The spread of the tearful repentance will begin in Jerusalem and move throughout the land and will involve _____. Zech 12:12 *And the land shall mourn, every family apart; the family of the house of David apart, and their wives apart; the family of the house of Nathan apart, and their wives apart; KJV*
- e. The results of this general repentance will appear immediately; there is a _____ cleansing for sin and uncleanness where the false prophets and false gods are forsaken. Zech 13:1-2 *In that day there shall be a fountain opened to the house of David and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin and for uncleanness. 2 And it shall come to pass in that day, saith the Lord of hosts, that I will cut off the names of the idols out of the land, and they shall no more be remembered: and also I will cause the prophets and the unclean spirit to pass out of the land. KJV*
- f. The long obduracy of the Nation of Israel will be finally ended and will open the way for world-wide _____ to follow. Ps 67:7 *God shall bless us; and all the ends of the earth shall fear him. KJV*

IV. The Regathering

- a. The regathering of historic Israel is one of the major themes of prophetic Scripture, beginning in the writings of Moses yet the sole notice of it in many _____ theological works is a denial that it will ever happen. Deut 30:3 *That then the Lord thy God will turn thy captivity, and have compassion upon thee, and will return and gather thee from all the nations, whither the Lord thy God hath scattered thee. KJV*
- b. This is difficult to understand because the same inspired word that predicted that they would be _____ throughout the world also predicted that the nation shall also be assembled. Jer 29:14 *And I will be found of you, saith the Lord: and I will turn away your captivity, and I will gather you from all the nations, and from all the places whither I have driven you, saith the Lord; and I will bring you again into the place whence I caused you to be carried away captive. KJV*
- c. This regathering will be _____ in its scope; no matter how far removed from the Promised Land they may have been driven, God will find them and return them to the land from which they have been scattered. Ezek 39:28 *Then shall they know that I am the Lord their God, which cause them to be led into captivity among the heathen: but I have gathered them unto their own land, and have left none of them any more there. KJV*
- d. This regathering will be accomplished with a great spiritual revival among the _____ ones. Ezek 34:15-16 *I will feed my flock, and I will cause them to lie down, saith the Lord God. 16 I will seek that which was lost, and bring again that which was driven away, and will bind up that which was broken, and will strengthen that which was sick: but I will destroy the fat and the strong; I will feed them with judgment. KJV*

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- e. While other restorations of Israel to her land have taken place, none has been complete nor have they been final. This one will be both complete and _____. Amos 9:15 *And I will plant them upon their land, and they shall no more be pulled up out of their land which I have given them, saith the Lord thy God. KJV*

V. The Judgment of Living Israelites

- a. Immediately following the regathering of Israel, but before they actually enter into the Promised Land God will enter into judgment of the Israelites in the wilderness of the _____ Peninsula. Ezek 20:35-36 *And I will bring you into the wilderness of the people, and there will I plead with you face to face. 36 Like as I pleaded with your fathers in the wilderness of the land of Egypt, so will I plead with you, saith the Lord God. KJV*
- b. This event hearkens back to a time of God's dealing _____ with Israel as He brought them out of Egypt. Deut 5:4 *The Lord talked with you face to face in the mount out of the midst of the fire, KJV*
- c. In this instance of God's dealing directly with regathered Israel, it will be a judicial dealing in which He purges out all _____. They will be brought out of whatever country where they reside but they shall not enter in to Israel. Ezek 20:38 *And I will purge out from among you the rebels, and them that transgress against me: I will bring them forth out of the country where they sojourn, and they shall not enter into the land of Israel: and ye shall know that I am the Lord. KJV*
- d. Out of this cleansed and separated _____ will come a people who will joyfully and humbly submit to their King. Ez 20:33 *As surely as I live, declares the Sovereign LORD, I will rule over you with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm and with outpoured wrath. NIV*
- e. To this end nothing essential will be left undone because judgment must _____ with the House of Israel. Ezek 20:40-44 *For on my holy mountain, the high mountain of Israel, declares the Sovereign LORD, there in the land the entire house of Israel will serve me, and there I will accept them. There I will require your offerings and your choice gifts, along with all your holy sacrifices. 41 I will accept you as fragrant incense when I bring you out from the nations and gather you from the countries where you have been scattered, and I will show myself holy among you in the sight of the nations. 42 Then you will know that I am the LORD, when I bring you into the land of Israel, the land I had sworn with uplifted hand to give to your fathers. 43 There you will remember your conduct and all the actions by which you have defiled yourselves, and you will loathe yourselves for all the evil you have done. 44 You will know that I am the LORD, when I deal with you for my name's sake and not according to your evil ways and your corrupt practices, O house of Israel, declares the Sovereign LORD." NIV*

VI. The Judgment of Living Gentiles

- a. The penal wrath of God has already been poured out on the Gentile nations but now the Mediatorial King has come down from heaven and set up His throne of judgment on earth, and he will now deal with the _____. Isa 2:4 *And he shall judge among the nations, and shall rebuke many people: and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruninghooks: nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. KJV*
- b. For this purpose there will be a _____ together of all those remaining nations who survived the world-wide infliction of the wrath of God and they will now undergo His judgment.
- c. They will see Him in His Regal glory, they will know about the judgment of Israel and now they will undergo a similar ordeal of _____. Joel 3:1-3 *For, behold, in those days, and in that time, when I shall bring again the captivity of Judah and Jerusalem, 2 I will also gather all nations, and will bring them down into the valley of Jehoshaphat, and will plead with them there for my people and for my heritage Israel, whom they have scattered among the nations, and parted my land. 3 And they have cast lots for my people; and have given a boy for an harlot, and sold a girl for wine, that they might drink. KJV*
- d. This period of judgment will take place _____ the great destruction of the attacking armies described in Joel 3:9-16
- e. While some have been _____ about all nations being brought to such a small area for judgment it must be remembered that the population will have be significantly reduced by the preceding cataclysmic events.
- f. This judgment will be of persons as well as _____ and it will be found that individuals bear some responsibility for the actions of their government.
- g. This is not a general judgment of _____, but only of living Gentiles on earth at the beginning of the Mediatorial Kingdom, as witnessed by the fact that there is no general resurrection which would be required for a general judgment.
- h. At the inauguration of the Kingdom on earth the judgment of God will make an absolute and final _____ between the righteous and the unrighteous, between those who rebel and those who submit to the King.
- i. Rebellious governments will be abolished; rebellious men will be destroyed so, in this respect the Millennial Kingdom will start with a _____. Isa 60:12 *For the nation and kingdom that will not serve thee shall perish; yea, those nations shall be utterly wasted. KJV*
